StoveTeam created a safe cooking stove, the ecocina, to resolve the issue of child mortality from carbon emissions from cooking fires. Breathing the smoke emitted from open fires is equivalent to three packs of cigarettes per day, resulting in frequent respiratory infections, permanent lung damage or
